Open burning permit expires on December 31st of the year of issuance and is valid for no more than twelve (12) days of burning during the year. No more than one (1) open burning permit may be issued for any parcel of land during the same calendar year. Based upon weather, air quality status and other factors, the Millersville Fire Department may prohibit open burning until conditions are more favorable. The Fire Department must be notified on the date of each burn by calling 859-2758 before the fire is started.

Statement of responsibility: "I will abide by all rules, regulations and policies of the City of Millersville, as established by the Millersville Code of Ordinances, the fire prevention codes adopted therein, and the requirements and restrictions set forth by the Millersville Fire Department. I understand that violation of rules, regulations or policies may result in revocation of the open burn permit and the imposition of other penalties prescribed by law."

Note: Until completely extinguished, fires must be attended at all times.

List of materials that can be burned in the City of Millersville

- Vegetation grown on the property of the burn site (limbs, plants, grass and leaves)
- Dead animals where no other safe and/or practical disposal method exists

List of materials that CAN NOT be burned in the City of Millersville

- Tires
- Other rubber products
- Vinyl shingles, siding
- Other plastics
- Asphalt shingles
- Other asphalt roofing materials
- Products that contain asbestos materials
- Carpet
- Vinyl flooring
- Electrical wiring
- Insulation
- Manufactured wood products (plywood, fiberboard, paneling and cardboard)
- Treated lumber or any other building materials
- Other products that contain a glue or resin to hold together

Any open fire that becomes offensive or objectionable due to smoke or odor emissions when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fire hazardous shall be prohibited. The codes official is authorized to order the extinguishment by the permit holder or the fire department of any open burning that creates or adds to a hazardous or objectionable situation.
