Old Shiloh Bridge

The TN Department of Transportation (TDOT) is doing the planning and engineering phase of this project. STORMWATER

The City of Millersville has been implementing our Stormwater Plan in accordance with the Federal requirements for several years. The costs associated with that have been coming from the General Fund. At this time, with the additional necessary factors required to effectively be in compliance, we see the need to fund the utility through user fees. The city evaluated the current stormwater requirements and analyzed the estimated costs associated with the utility so it can be able to maintain the stormwater system without a substantial increase in the property tax rate.

Do Other Cities do this? Yes, Goodlettsville is also on the EPA list and White House has implemented theirs as a proactive action.

Do all properties pay this fee? Yes regardless of size and use. Bonified active agricultural properties that can provide proof of the activity are the only exempted properties.

Why are the stormwater and sewer systems separate?

Unlike wastewater, which is treated before it is released back into the environment, stormwater goes directly into a community's ponds, streams and lakes. Because stormwater comes in large amounts at unpredictable times, treating it as wastewater would be very expensive.

Impaired Streams

According to the EPA's 303(d) list, the following streams within the City of Millersville are classified as impaired due to either e.Coli contamination (bacteria), siltation (fine layers of dirt on the bottom of the stream which inhibit growth and oxygen levels), and/or habitat alterations (destroying or removing habitat vegetation). The City has in place several Best Management Practices (BMPs) in order to help improve the water's quality with the ultimate goal of removing these water bodies from the EPA's 303(d) list. Opportunities for improving water quality are protecting existing or restoring vegeta-

tion along stream banks, properly caring for lawns, picking up after pets, proper containment during construction activities, etc.

Mansker Creek

Mansker Creek flows through Millersville into Goodlettsville. Mansker Creek flows directly into the Cumberland River. Mansker Creek suffers from e.Coli contamination and land development issues. Mansker Creek is impaired for 15.5 miles. Mansker Creek is served by runoff from tributaries, roadways, pavement, commercial and residential land - a mixed urban/agricultural classification.

Slater's Creek

Slater's Creek flows through Millersville and according to the EPA, Slater's Creek suffers from e.Coli contamination, bank modifications, and sand/gravel/rock discharges from a local rock quarry. Slater's Creek is impaired for 11.3 miles. Slater's Creek is served by runoff from tributaries, roadways, pavement, commercial and residential land - a mixed urban/agricultural classification.

StreamWatch

The Cities of Millersville and Goodlettsville are working together to involve local citizens who are concerned about the environment in which they live and the quality of water that they use on a daily basis.

We'd like to introduce you to the StreamWatch Program and encourage you to get involved to volunteer and help make a difference with your local streams and creeks. The group meets on a quarterly basis for about an hour to share ideas, upcoming events, water quality concerns, and project successes.

Things to remember...

Keep leaves and grass clippings out of gutters, storm drains, ditches, ponds and creeks.


Remove leaves from catch inlets to avoid local flooding.

Do not dispose of yard waste/debris into water quality facilities, detention ponds, swales (low lying or depressed wet


